

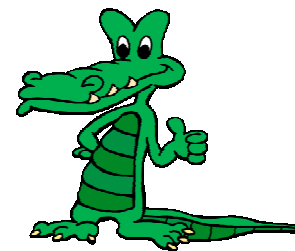

Jeremy is the Cambridge AICE and Center for Arts and Media Coordinator at North Fort Myers High School. A graduate of Ithaca, College in Upstate New York, he earned a B.A. in English Education and taught for five years in the Canastota School District before relocating to Florida. Since arriving in Fort Myers, Jeremy has been teaching at North Fort Myers High School. Over the course of his eleven years at North, Jeremy taught 9th and 10th grade ELA, as well as AICE General Paper. Five years ago he took over as the coordinator for Special Programs in the building in addition to teaching two sections of AICE Global Perspectives.

As coordinator of the two magnet programs at North, Jeremy is responsible for the application/audition process, which consistently helps North High rank as the most selected school in the West Zone. Furthermore, he helps schedule and register students for AICE examinations each November and again in June - North averages 900 candidates who take roughly 2,000 examinations each testing session. The Cambridge AICE Program at North is by far the largest in Lee County and among the biggest in the state of Florida. More than 100 students earn the coveted AICE Diploma each spring, which helps them secure the top Bright Futures Scholarship.

Jeremy also teaches AICE Global Perspectives at North High. Global Perspectives requires students to study current events and global issues from a variety of points of view. Students will break down global issues like climate change and terrorism before conducting research from all different walks of life. The course was designed by the University of Cambridge in conjunction with a number of Ivy League and Ivy Plus Institutions and is required for all candidates wishing to earn the AICE Diploma. Students focus on presentation, debate, extended response, and collaborative skills while reflecting on their views about world issues in comparison to existing perspectives. Over the course of the last five years North has enjoyed a 96% pass rate on the AICE Global Perspectives examination.
